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PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The 2007-08 year saw the club continuing its rebuilding process, with membership numbers the highest since 2002-03 at 58 members. In the 2007 winter season, the club again finished third in the APSOC Division 1 competition. In the summer AV competition, the club failed to make the finals, however the 2007-08 year was highlighted by a number of outstanding individual performances:

- Life member Andrew Jamieson was named Male World Masters Athlete of the Year after winning five gold medals at the World Masters Championships in Italy in September. Andrew holds all of the M60 world walking records except the 50K walk. Part of his prize was a trip to attend the IAAF Gala dinner in Monaco.
- Harry Borthwick won the Victorian U18 200m Championship. Harry also equalled the club U17 & U18 100m records.
- Rob Schwerkolt won the Victorian M40 800m and 1500m Championships. He was also second in the 400m.
- Byron Smith was second in the Victorian U20 400m hurdles and third in the 110m hurdles. He was ranked fourth in the State in the 400m hurdles.
- Darcy Long was third in the Victorian U23 800m.
- Andrew Wheeler was second in the Victorian U20 triple jump.

A highlight of the winter season was Nick Wallace-Smith's detailed and entertaining newsletters, and it was great to see a number of schoolboys competing during school holidays – a direct result of Nick's training at the school. In the summer season a number of initiatives were re-introduced this season, including a highest point score award to encourage weekly participation, but more importantly, competing in a number of events. An athlete of the week award was also introduced to recognize weekly performances. And because of the number of overage athletes now competing, the club this year began recognising M40 and M50 club records.

To continue to progress we need to improve our liaison with the school. Steve Gaffney does an outstanding job recruiting at the school, but I would urge any university students or anyone else who can help to turn up to some of the school training days or school meets. We desperately need to recruit distance runners and field game athletes. I remind all members that the club is open not only to students or past students of the school, but also to any of their friends and acquaintances.

On a sad note, the club lost two of its most loyal and dedicated members with the passing of life members, Bob Grant and Graham Wise. Bob was an Olympian, competing in the 1956 Melbourne games in the javelin. Bob won the state javelin title on four occasions as well as the 1955 national title. Graham was a very active member of the club from the 1950's. He was second in the state mile title in 1964 and went on to establish a world M40 record for the 800m. Graham was instrumental in helping to recruit numerous athletes to the club.

Finally, I would like to thank all members of the committee for their commitment during the year.

CROSS COUNTRY REPORT 2007

The 76th APSOC season was an exhibition of brilliant individual performances for Old Scotch, but unfortunately the team results were hindered by inconsistency and a lack of depth. At the forefront of the team was Robert Schwerkolt, who ran aggressively all season and placed second overall in the APSOC Male Athlete of the Year Award. Other athletes who performed exceptionally well during the season were Adrian Wallis, Peter Simm and Darcy Long. Notably, President Stuart Facey, who has improved remarkably over the last three seasons, placed second in both the Hooley and Kelso awards.

Despite failing to perform consistently in the teams events, Old Scotch had plenty of consistent athletes who were able to claim the title of Spartan for the season. No fewer than nine athletes were presented with their bottle of wine at the annual dinner. These athletes were Stuart Facey, Andrew Aitken, Nick Wallace-Smith, David Lightfoot, Peter Dodgshun, Jon Holmes, Lisa Lightfoot, Tamami Koike and Colin Findlay. In addition, Robert Schwerkolt and Lynn Kisler completed twelve out of the thirteen events for the season. A total of fifty athletes competed for Old Scotch including several promising schoolboy athletes in Will Vigors, Chris Baker, Charlie Blanch, Caleb Griffiths, Daniel Li and Jack Daly.

The Jamieson – 3rd

Old Scotch resumed where it finished in the previous season, placing third. Rob Schwerkolt, Peter Simm and Adrian Wallis came fifth, sixth and seventh respectively. In the handicap race, Andrew Aitken made a strong return to cross-country coming second, while Sam Curry was fifth.

The Dyson Relay – 4th

The Dyson is a traditional favourite. This race around the Tan brings out the big guns from all clubs. Old Scotch held on to fourth place despite some notable absentees. James Atkinson broke twelve minutes and came eighth, while Adrian Wallis placed tenth, Rob Schwerkolt eleventh and Darcy Long fourteenth.

The Geelong Relay – 3rd

Old Scotch rebounded from its fourth place at the Dyson to come third at the Geelong Relay. The open team consisted of Robert Schwerkolt, Peter Simm who caught up several positions on his anchor leg, Sam Curry and Andrew Pirie.

The Hooley Relay – 2nd

This is the event which Old Scotch had threatened to knock Haileybury from its mantle for the past two seasons. We had an exceptionally strong team in for this difficult 4 x 2 person relay of Robert Schwerkolt, Darcy Long, Adrian Wallis and Peter Simm, who came second, within a minute of Haileybury. Adrian Wallis recorded the second fastest time for the day.

The Williamson – 7th

The Williamson was a disaster for Old Scotch. Our top six featured four athletes who had not made the top six for a number of seasons.

The Cooke-McClland – 6th

The Cooke-McClland was another disappointing result for Old Scotch. A sixth place was achieved, which meant that Old Scotch just held onto third place overall in the APSOC Championship.

The APS United winter cross country team had another successful and enjoyable season. The women's team, in only its second year, contributed strongly to the club's good health. The open men's teams struggled early in the season, which resulted in lower finishing ladder positions for them than in 2006.

The M40 team won gold medals at the Jells Park Relays and bronze at the Sandown Relays, and also won several of the other events, but still needed to win the final event, the Tan Relays, to take the premiership. Rob Schwerkolt had been the team's strongest runner all year and when he took the baton for the last leg, the team was in second place. Rob proceeded to run down the leading team, Keilor-St Bernards, and cross the line first to give APSU its first ever winter premiership. Scott Lawrence was another valuable member of the M40 squad.

Overall, APSU recorded the following ladder results:

Div 1 - 8th, Div 3 - 12th, Div 5 - 14th

M40 - 1st, M50 - 5th

Women div 1 - 5th, div 4 - 7th

Among other OS runners, Ant Rickards and Pete Simm were regular members of the division 1 team. Darcy Long showed strong improvement, including a PB 10 km at Sandown. Our M50 group of Oehr, Facey and Holmes, plus Bruce Wilson (M60), continued to be competitive in their division, highlighted by a silver medal at Jells Park. Bruce won an individual bronze medal in his age group in the Yarra Bend 8 km. Lynn Kisler was a regular runner for the women's team and part of the winning division 4 team at Yarra Bend.

TRACK AND FIELD REPORT

The 2007-08 summer athletics season saw several terrific individual achievements within the club despite only mild success for both our open teams.

The underage teams had very promising seasons, only hindered by low turnouts during the exam period in late November and early December. Andrew Wheeler had a great season, breaking the U18 javelin and U20 decathlon club records, as well as finishing second in the triple jump and fourth in the decathlon in the Victorian Championships. Byron Smith also performed well this season, finishing second in the 400m hurdles and third in the 110m hurdles in the Victorian Championships, and fifth in the 400m hurdles in the Australian Championships. Both Byron's speed on the track and Andrew's skill in the field events will prove invaluable as they move into the open teams next year.

Another high achiever was Harry Borthwick who also ran in the Victorian Championships, winning gold in the U18 200m. On top of this, he equalled the U17 and U18 100m club record only days after his seventeenth birthday. On the same day, Harry and fellow runners James McIlraith, Jackson Finlay and Andrew Walker teamed up to break the club's 4 x 400m relay record. The promise shown by the underage teams was one of the highlights of the season and you can be sure you will be hearing more about all of the team members into the future.

The division 1 and 3 teams were held back this year due to limited participation. However, there were still a number of excellent individual performances. Rob Schwerkolt had an outstanding season. Competing in the M40 Victorian Championships, Rob collected two firsts, a second and a third in the 800m, 1500m, 400m and 5000m respectively. Rob also obtained M40 club records for in the 400m, 800m, 1500, 3000m and 5000m with some incredible times, most notably 3:59.0 for the 1500m and 8:44.5 for the 3000m.

Life member Andrew Jamieson also had a brilliant year, with nine world records in the walk distances from 3000m to 30km together with gold medal winning performances in the WMA championships in Riccione, Italy. This success led to Andrew being awarded the 2007 IAAF Male Masters Athlete of the Year award in November 2007.

Congratulations to the award winners and all members of the club for season 2007-08. It was a season of numerous successes for individual members and it is evident that we have the talent to accomplish great things as a team in the various divisions. I would encourage every member to be out on the track from round 1 next season, as it is a short season and participation is the key to success as a team.
